Course Description:

Analysis of real-time and step-time digital sequencing techniques and graphic editing of MIDI data. Training in drum programming, bass line creation, and song manipulation techniques such as quantization and transposition. Prerequisite MUSIC 126. Concurrent enrolment in MUSIC 127.

Materials:

- I will leave a copy of *Digital Musician's Handbook* in Studio I for your reference. This is my personal copy and is NOT to be removed from the studios.
- Flash Drive for backups

Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Use MOTU Digital Performer software to record, play back, and edit musical creations.
- Create a simple eight-bar song fragment incorporating drums/rhythm, chords/harmony, bass, and melody tracks.
- Demonstrate basic Macintosh skills such as naming and saving files, copying files from hard drive to Zip disk, etc.
- Read simple sheet music in grand staff format, then use step-entry to enter the music into MOTU Performer.

- Demonstrate knowledge of basic symbols of musical expression, e.g. accent mark, crescendo, legato marking, staccato marking, etc.
- Manipulate MIDI data to achieve the effect of the symbols of musical expression mentioned directly above.
- Create four different pop drum beats.
- Create a simple pop bass line from the chord symbols on a lead sheet.
