Course Description:

Study of popular music in the United States from the 1600s to the present. Lectures and recordings will focus on vocal and instrumental styles, including martial music, ragtime, jazz, swing rock, and punk. No prior knowledge of music is required.

Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Identify many popular artists, songs, styles, and genres by ear. This will be accomplished through auditory analysis of musical elements, voice types, instrumentation, rhythmic patterns, and song forms.
- Demonstrate knowledge of biographical information on major and influential figures in popular music.
- Discuss how social, economic, and technological forces have shaped the development of popular music trends.
- Define creative, legal, and business terms and discuss concepts from the popular music industry.
