### **Objectives**

- o To experience the complete process of creating music beginning with imagination and ending up in live performance.
- To develop composition skills.
- o To create new pieces of music.
- To model the creative process as a fundamental human activity and need. The ability to use one's imagination to create solutions to problems is ultimately the most important skill in any field of endeavor.

#### **Composition Assignments**

These assignments are the most important activities of the class. They will be graded on the score quality (clarity, accuracy, neatness), as well as the performance quality, and the piece itself, including to what extent it adheres to the assignment constraints. Even though some assignments may be performed by you or a friend, scores should be clear enough so that anyone who is interested could use your score and create a performance that credibly adheres to your wishes without you being present. Often very clear verbal instructions can make a score much easier to understand, even if it uses conventional notation. Remember also that your performance is just as important as the composition, since, in the world of the composer-performer, the two are inseparable.

#### <u>Portfolio</u>

You will hand in a copy of your portfolio at the end of the semester and it will serve as your final project/exam. It should be a presentable and, hopefully, beautiful collection of the compositions that you have composed and performed during the semester. It should be bound in some way. Three ring binders are very practical since items can be added or removed. I will give extra credit for unusual, interesting, or beautiful binding and you may enlist the aid of a friend in the design of this portfolio.

#### Final Concert

The class will present a concert of compositions composed for the class at the end of the semester (hopefully during the scheduled time in finals week).

# **Composition Assignments**

Composition 1: To be performed by one audience member. Give a description of an

experience that takes no more than an hour which can be experienced

beginning somewhere on campus.

Composition 2: Compose a piece for your group to perform that does not require

rehearsal.

Composition 3: A piece that uses voice, but no singing.

Composition 4: A solo piece for your instrument that uses only sounds that your

instrument was not meant to make. You may include

attachments/preparations to your instrument.

Composition 5: This will be a larger midterm project to be defined later.

Composition 6: Compose a piece that structures improvisation in a new or unusual

way.

Composition 7: A piece that involves audience participation or some kind of planned

audience involvement.

Composition 8: This will be a larger final project to be defined later.

Revisions: Pick any two of your pieces and revise them both. Choose one of these

to perform on the due date.

o All compositions are to be rehearsed in time for the in-class performance on the due date.
